TAIWAN CONVENING 2024 TO BE MODERN

Modern heritage preservation faces significant challenges worldwide due to insufficient appreciation and inadequate preservation efforts. This issue is particularly pronounced in Taiwan, where local identification and heritage protection measures are still in their early stages of development. Consequently, there is a pressing need to foster knowledge exchange and draw insights from the outcomes of regional projects like the KIM project.

Tunghai University is poised to play a crucial role in addressing this challenge. The university will serve as the host for a gathering aimed at involving its architecture students from year 1 to 5, as well as graduate students, in an experiential learning process. They will actively apply the CMP (Conservation Management Planning) five-stage process to realworld heritage sites, namely Luce Memorial Chapel and the adjacent Arts Centre.

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Following this hands-on engagement, the students will participate in workshops alongside seminar attendees and guest lecturers. The event, named 'Taiwan Convening 2024,' will span multiple venues, including Luce Memorial Chapel, the Art Centre, the Cogndon House, and the Ming-Sheng Auditorium. Remarkably, the latter three structures were also designed by the chief architect responsible for Luce Memorial Chapel and are situated in close proximity.

This panel discussion, unfolding over three days within the meticulously planned campus of Tunghai University, crafted by notable architects like I.M. Pei, C.K. Chen, and C.K. Chang, will feature key figures from diverse countries, including Australia, the USA, Japan, Italy, Turkey, India, and Chile. These experts will share their valuable experiences and insights on conservation management planning, offering a unique opportunity to advance the cause of preserving modern heritage in Taiwan and beyond.
